INTERNSHIP DIRECTORS:

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PROGRAM OVERVIEW:

The Community-based Pharmacy Administration & Leadership Internship is a two-year program providing experiencing across three Carolina Care Pharmacy Network (CCPN) outpatient pharmacies at the UNC Medical Center (Central Outpatient Pharmacy, Employee Pharmacy, and Hillsborough Outpatient Pharmacy) and Transitions of Care services. The student intern will be exposed to projects relating to discharge workflow, the meds-to-beds program, medication histories, as well as projects relating to traditional retail settings. The intern will also engage in a longitudinal project with the aim of being able to present a poster at a conference.

There are a multitude of opportunities for the student intern to explore, including: competency in staffing an outpatient pharmacy, administrative projects relating to workflows/compliance, professional development through scheduled weekly/biweekly 1:1 meetings, networking with current residents, shadowing opportunities related to the intern's interests, as well as gaining experience with the UNC Pharmacy Assistance Program (PAP) for patients with limited or low healthcare coverage.

PROGRAM FORMAT:

Start Date:	May or July (dependent on student's rotation schedule)
Duration:	2 years (paid)
Time Commitment:	During The School Year: • 4 hours per week (intern-specific projects) • Staffing: every 3rd weekend • Includes one major and one minor holiday During Breaks: • • Flexible (depending on project needs and year in program) • Staffing: every 3rd weekend • Includes one major and one minor holiday During Rotations: • • No weekly project requirement • Staffing: every 3rd weekend • Includes one major and one minor holiday
Year 1:	 Summer after PY1: 2-MONTH onboarding (40 hours/week) when the student is not on rotation. Staffing every third weekend once competent in outpatient workflow.
Year 2:	 <u>PY2 Year:</u> Follows normal time commitments listed above. <u>PY2 Summer:</u> Flexible based on specific projects, needs, and intern's interest.

I applied for the CCPN internship to gain experience in hospital pharmacy and have longitudinal pharmacy experience that would add to my education at ESOP. As a CCPN intern, I have learned about outpatient hospital pharmacy, transitions of care, and the role of a pharmacist when a patient is discharging.
