

Inpatient Pediatrics with Kelly Clark:

The HDFS intern will have the opportunity to shadow members of the pediatric therapy team (OT, PT, SLP, CCLS) in the care and support of children and families in the children's hospital and related clinics. In doing so, the intern will work with the manager and clinical supervisor to carry out a project to enhance pediatric therapy services. Tasks include but not limited to needs assessment, program design/development, grant writing, and creating patient/family and/or staff education materials.

Inpatient Pediatrics with Sarah Frantz:

The intern's responsibilities would primarily be administrative for an HDFS intern, with the exception of attending some groups/retreat in person or virtually including:

- Helping plan, organize, and facilitate our Peds Hematology-Oncology psychosocial programs including but not limited to our Spring Family retreat (April 15th), Spring/Fall Teddy Bear Clinic, UNC & CPAL Festival of Hope (September 23rd), Summer athletics event, monthly teen and parent groups, school re-entry programs, and helping me organize CPAL volunteer matches with patients
- Create flyers for programs (must be skilled/have an eye for graphic design/Canva), help organize and facilitate ways to get word out about programs and groups (for example, working on some slide shows to be displayed on our TV in our clinic waiting area)
- Organize donations, toys, materials in clinic. Help clean areas as needed, re-stock items, etc.

OP pelvic health with Kristen Soth:

Tasks for OP Therapy Services may include managing clinic supplies lists, participate in quality initiatives including documentation and charge reviews/audits, website content auditing and construction of marketing materials, collating patient educational materials.

Education Team with Kristel Maes and Amber Corbin:

Support projects related to student, staff, and patient education in both in- and outpatient healthcare setting. Data analysis, program support and administrative tasks.

Organizational talents with an eye for detail is a must. Knowledge of excel preferred.

Opportunities to observe disciplines such as PT, OT and SLP based on interest along with professional development opportunities. Part time on-site, part time work from home.

Outpatient Audiology with English King

Testing of Pediatric Patients: All children between the ages of 9 months and 5 years of age need an assist (extra pair of hands to instruct and condition child to task) in order to behaviorally test their hearing in the sound booth.

In addition to direct patient care as test assist, there may be need for intern to assist with:

- Cleaning and sanitizing of equipment and toys between patients

- Completion of hearing aid order and repair forms
- Assist staff with mailing of hearing aids and earmolds to patients/families
- Monitoring, organizing, stocking supplies as needed in sound booths and hearing aid fitting rooms
- Prepare sound booths and hearing aids rooms for patient

IP rehab with Kelly Fletcher

The HDFS intern will have the opportunity to work with an interdisciplinary rehab team comprised of Physical Therapy, Occupational Therapy, Speech Therapy, and Rec Therapists. The HDFS intern will assist with updating materials used to educate patients either in print or on social media platforms. Additionally, the intern will assist with special programming updates such as the makerspace, and AbleGamers. They will also have the opportunity to round on patients and caregivers to collect feedback in real time on how the rehab stay and communication are going.

Acute Care Physical and Occupational Therapy with Emily Hoke:

The HDFS intern would have an interest in quality improvement and hospital operations to provide support to projects, program development, and training procedures. Opportunities to shadow Occupational and Physical Therapists will be included. Tasks may include, but are not limited to, data collection and analysis, assisting with project documentation, development of educational materials, and feasibility assessments. Strong skills in communication, organization, and data management are preferred.

Mental Health with Shelley Ashcroft:

The HDFS intern will have the opportunity to work with an interdisciplinary team comprised of Recreational Therapy, Music Therapy, Occupational Therapy, and Activities Therapy. The intern will have tasks including, but not limited to, assisting with project development and documentation, development and maintenance of educational materials, and data collection and implementation. Strong skills in communication, organization, and self-directed learning preferred.
